Gihosoft TubeGet: YouTube Video Downloader App

Gihosoft TubeGet is a free app that can download videos from youtube.com or other video sharing sites like Vimeo, Facebook, and Twitter, to your hard drive or other storage media. It is a simple and straightforward program, easy to learn and easy to use.

Download the app from www.gihosoft.com where there are versions for both Windows and Mac computers and install it.

To download a video from youtube.com:

1. Go to the video on youtube.com and start running the video to ensure the URL is for the video you want to download.
2. Copy the URL of the video from the address box at the top of the screen.
3. Now start up Gihosoft from the Windows Start menu. Because Gihosoft also offers a premium version, the first screen that displays, shown here, is a full screen ad promoting the advanced features of the paid version and prompting you to Get Activation Key. Click the X at the upper right to close that screen and continue with the free version.

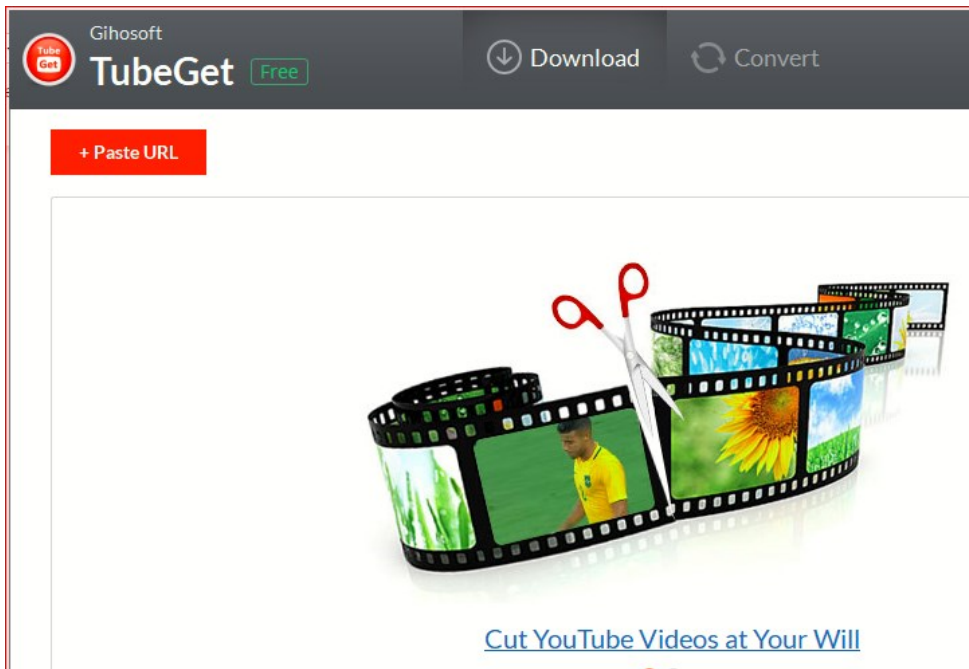

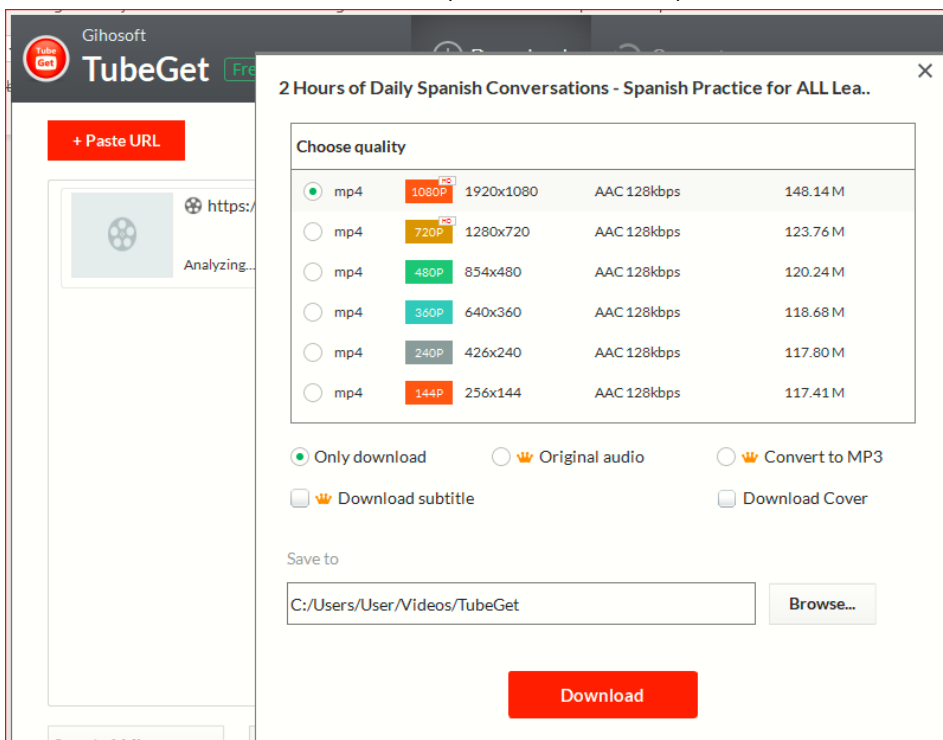

4. In the next screen, click the red Paste URL button at the upper left. If there was a delay between copying the URL and opening Gihosoft TubeGet, you may have to switch back to youtube.com and copy the URL again.



5. When the URL is pasted in Gihosoft TubeGet, the Gihosoft TubeGet app analyzes the URL and, if there is no problem with it, prompts you to choose the format for the downloaded video. There are several sizes for the MP4 files to choose from. Click in the circle next to the size you want. Note: some additional choices such as Download Subtitles are only available in the premium version..

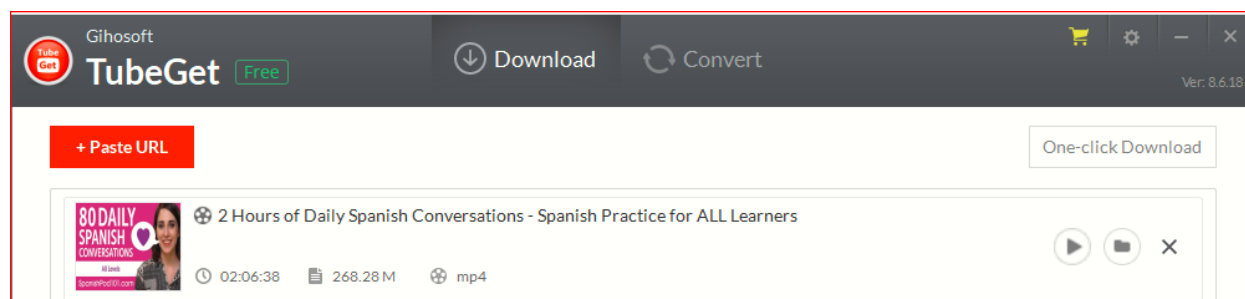


This window also displays at the bottom the location where the file can be found on your computer, usually in the Videos folder and then in a subfolder named TubeGet, which is created by Gihosoft.

6. Click the Download button and the following window displays the progress of the download as it goes to work.

Once the download is complete the window displays the file size. Three buttons at the right allow you to play the video or locate the file in the folder or delete the entry here in the list.

The limits for the free version are that you can only download 5 videos per day, but there does not seem to be a limit to the length of the video, as you can see in this example where the video is 2 hours long. And download time is relatively speedy.



I have used Gihosoft TubeGet for several months now and can highly recommend it. Give it a try! 🖥️

MACS VS WINDOWS PCS

Join Larry for a presentation on MAC vs PC where he compares features and shows you the pros and cons of each.

Many of you are probably Windows users, but maybe you're a Windows user because that's what you have used all your life and probably have never considered anything else. But, there may come a day when you will be faced with the need to upgrade or get a new computer.

Larry will show you why you should consider leaving Microsoft Windows and go with an Apple product such as a MAC Mini, Macbook Pro laptop, or an integrated unit such as the iMac.

- Some of you will undoubtedly say that you don't want to learn a new operating system.
- Some of you will dismiss alternatives as too expensive.
- Some of you may fear the unknown because of having to learn something new.

Some of you will say there are Windows programs you have to have that you can't get on a MAC.

He hopes to dispel some of these myths as he explains the similarities between a MAC and a PC. Larry will show you that you can switch without it costing an arm and a leg as you may have thought.

Larry will give you compelling reasons why MAC PC's are easier to use, safer from virus', and provide applications that are not bloated in size, saving you money on storage costs, not to

mention the ease of transferring applications from one MAC to another or even that of transferring your Windows files using the built-in features in the MAC. He will also show you how backup and restoration of your files are made simple and, more importantly, testable so that should the day come that you need them, you can be assured they will work.

As a certified Microsoft Engineer with hundreds of Windows applications to his credit, he discovered the ease of using a MAC when he decided to write an iOS application for his iPhone. The only way to compile it was on a MAC PC, so he purchased his first MAC Mini in 2012 and after a short time using it, switched exclusively to using a MAC for all of his computer needs. Larry has never looked back but, as you will learn, there are ways to have your cake and eat it too by running a copy of your favorite Windows OS right on your MAC for those times when nothing but Windows will solve your problem.
